How can we invite and include Latino families in

If you would like to invite and include Latino families in 4-H consider the following:

- -Don't do it alone
- -Assume that people are bilingual

Create a Welcoming Group Meeting

- Consider the daily schedule of the participants when setting times
- Make personal invitations to the meeting through visits or phone calls
- Supplement personal invitations with bilingual print information
- Recruit Latinos by advertising in Latino churches, markets, business, and Spanish newspapers
- Utilize Spanish Radio spots
- Hold meetings in locations where the people will be comfortable
- Make it a social event (music, food, etc)
- Have something for people to do or look at when they arrive before the meeting begins
- Accommodate language preferences. Ask at the start which language the group prefers.
- Greet people at the door
- Plan for late arrivals

- Planee su evento de manera que pueda incluir a la gente que llegue tarde.



One is a basic report and the other follows and supports the iSprout curriculum.

Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM)

2016 4-H National Youth Science Day (4-H NYSD)

The 9th annual 4-H NYSD Challenge will be held on Wednesday, October 5, 2016, and will bring youth together from all around the nation to complete this single, innovative activity. The 2016 4-H National Youth Science Day Challenge will explore how remote sensing can be used to solve real world problems while learning concepts like flight dynamics, forces of flight, basic computer coding, as well as following federal regulations while operating drones.

Drones for Ag

Drones are appearing everywhere these days, thanks in large part to rapid advances in the technology and reductions in cost. Most drones sold today are used by hobbyists, however these flying robots have become important tools in many fields including agriculture. Also known as Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs), drones have become a game changer for ag because they can produce extremely detailed images and be flown when you like, as often as you like, and you get the images almost immediately. Farmers are using drones to monitor crops for anything undesirable, including water stress, nutrient problems, pest damage, and disease. This allows them to nip problems in the bud and apply treatments more strategically and efficiently.

Most UAVs allow you to program a flight path on a tablet, so you can fly the exact same area multiple times and overlay the images on top of each other to see change. To get the most out of the drone data, the images have to be stitched together in a process called mosaicking, and analyzed with special software that knows what to look for. Some software can even tell you the height of plants by comparing how they look from different angles. This allows farmers to measure growth rates and plan operations. Likewise ranchers and foresters are using drones to measure the health and structure of rangelands and trees, as well as find lost livestock.

Scientists in the UC Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources are experimenting with new ways that drones can be used for agriculture and rangeland management. The IGIS program in ANR teaches workshops in drone operations, including safety, regulations, and data analysis. The theme of this year's National Youth Science Day is drone exploration, so this is a great opportunity for youth to learn about what these amazing devices can do!








Spring 2016 Spark Survey Highlights
